<u>PORCH</u> – The Lords Food Pantry received 3,225 pounds of food in July from the PORCH collection.


<u>Grants</u> – No grants received in July. Landfall Grants will be announced in October.

The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP)

In July, we served 93 families, or 324 individuals (103 children, 132 adults, and 89 seniors).

Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP)

We received 80 boxes in July. We distributed 72 boxes on July 15, and 8 on July 22.
